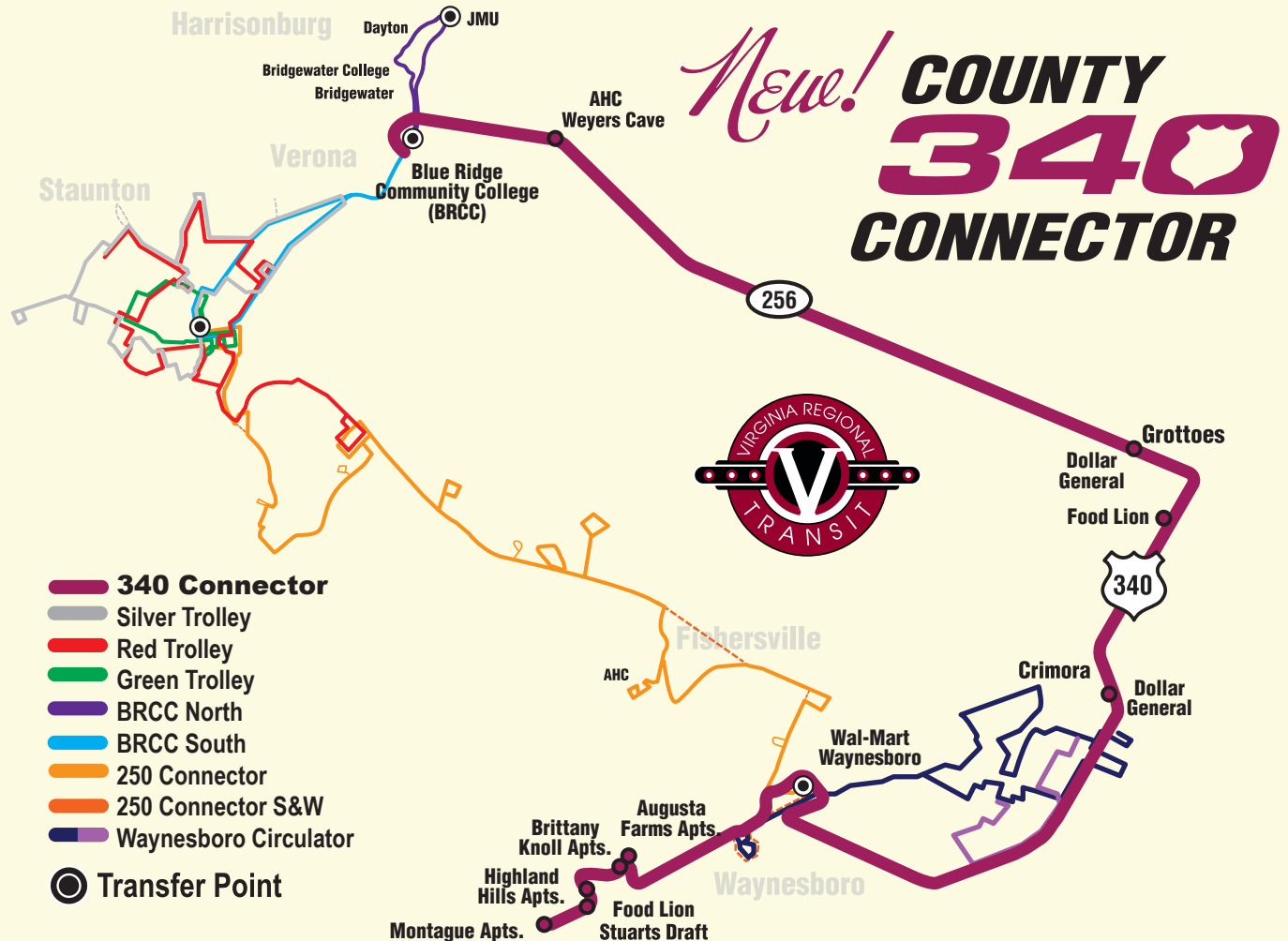

Public Transportation Options Fixed Route

Virginia Regional Transit is the transit provider for the CATS mountain region. VRT provides both fixed route and demand response bus transportation to a variety of local communities to include the cities of Staunton, Waynesboro, the counties of Augusta, Rockingham and Blue-Ridge Community College along the I-81 Corridor. The popular 250 Connector operates along the Route 250 Corridor which stretches from Staunton to Waynesboro. A major stop on this route is at the Augusta Health and users of the 250 Connector can ride the bus free to the hospital. The new County 340 Connector runs from Stuarts Draft to the Weyers Cave BRCC campus hub Mon.-Fri. The 340 Connector also stops at the Waynesboro Wal-Mart hub and serves the communities and towns along the 340 and 256 portions of the route that includes Crimora and Grottoes. The public fixed route service is designed to provide a seamless transfer between fixed routes at transfer locations. The fixed routes provide connections to other regional bus services such as Harrisonburg Transit at the JMU campus. All VRT buses are wheelchair accessible.

Fixed Route Fares: .50¢ each way • **Trolley Rides are FREE** • **College students with proper ID ride FREE** • **Passengers going to/from AHC ride FREE** • **transfers between fixed routes are FREE**

Demand Response

Demand Service is curb to curb. It is open to the general public and is by reservation. All equipment is lift equipped and handicapped accessible. Rides can be booked as far out as 2 weeks in advance and at a minimum at least 24 hours in advance. We encourage riders to book earlier rather than later. Scheduled riders should be prepared to leave 20 minutes before or after a scheduled ride appointment time. Passengers unable to ride by themselves are permitted to bring a personal assistant for free.
