



Are you a college student who could use help paying for groceries each month?

The USDA Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as food stamps, is temporarily expanding student eligibility.



Now, students enrolled at least part-time in a higher education institution who either:

- ✔ **are eligible to participate in state or federally-financed work-study** during the regular school year (it is not required to actually participate in work-study),
 - ✔ **have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0 in the current academic year**
- may be eligible for SNAP by meeting income requirements and additional criteria.*



SNAP Monthly Income Limits to Qualify

Household Size	Max. Gross (total income before taxes/other deductions)
1	\$1383
2	\$1868
3	\$2353

Monthly amounts go up \$486 for each additional person
