2. CYSE 200T, CYSE 300, 3 credits of Cyber Principles and 3 credits of Cyber Applications are met by completion of AAS and grade of C or higher in the designated courses.
3. ITN 260 and ITP 100 or CSC 200 used to fulfill CYSE 250.
4. These courses can be taken at ODU or PVCC. If taken at PVCC, student must choose courses from ODU's VCCS Transfer Guide <http://www.odu.edu/transfer/vccs-transfer-guide.html>; in the following categories: 9 credits in Philosophy and Ethics, Interpreting the Past, Human Creativity, Literature or Foreign Language; 8 credits in Nature of Science. Remaining lower-division general education requirements are met by completion of all courses outlined in this transfer agreement guide.

Notes (continued):

- Lower-Division General Education waiver and course substitutions are not automatic upon enrollment to ODU, students must notify academic advisor for these to be processed upon verification.
- Students with successful completion of selected industry certifications will receive CYSE 3ELE (3 credits per certificate, up to 6 credits maximum).
