The USDA Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as food stamps, is temporarily expanding student eligibility.



Now, students enrolled at least part-time in a higher education institution who either:

or ·

are <u>eligible</u> to participate in state or federally-financed work-study during the regular school year (it is not required to actually participate in work-study),

have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0 in the current academic year

may be eligible for SNAP by meeting income requirements and additional criteria.*
