Course Success Rate

Blue Ridge Community College measures course success rate based on grades of A, B, C, Pass (P), and Satisfactory (S).

a. Face-to-Face Course Success Rate

Target: 85% of students at BRCC will successfully complete their Face-to-Face courses.

Threshold of Acceptability: 80% of BRCC students will pass their Face-to-Face courses.

BRCC's retention rate is the percentage of students from the fall cohort who either returned to BRCC in the following spring/fall semester or graduated from BRCC before the end of fall.


a. Fall-to-Spring Retention Rate


b. Fall-to-Spring FTIC Retention Rate


c. Fall-to-Fall Retention Rate


d. Fall-to-Fall FTIC Retention Rate

Target: The total number of awards conferred in the current year is equal to or greater than that of those conferred in the previous year.

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC will confer awards within a -15% change from the previous year.


Conclusion: In the 2022-23 academic year, BRCC awarded 858 degrees, representing a 32% decrease from the previous year. This is outside our acceptable threshold of a 15% change.

Conclusion: In 2022-23, BRCC had 556 graduates, a 34% decrease from the previous year, which falls below our acceptable -15% threshold.

c. Overall Cohort Total Completion Rate

BRCC has identified the National Student Clearinghouse Total Completion Rate as the graduation rate metric with SACSCOC.

The cohort includes students who are new to college, have transferred, readmitted, or are seeking a credential. It also includes students taking college remedial or developmental courses, those who have earned a degree or certificate at BRCC or another institution, and those currently enrolled at BRCC or another institution within three years.

Target: BRCC aims to ensure that 35% of students in each cohort complete their program successfully.

Threshold of Acceptability: The overall cohort completion rate of BRCC will be 30%.


1) Overall Cohort Total Completion Rate by Gender


2) Overall Cohort Total Completion Rate by Race/Ethnicity

Target: 30% of Black students, 30% of Hispanic students, 35% of Two or More Races, and 37% of White students will complete their studies within three years.

Threshold of Acceptability: 25% of Black students, 25% of Hispanic students, 30% of Two or More Races, and 32% of White students will complete their studies within three years.

This aligns with the acceptable 25% completion rate threshold for black students. On the other hand, 30% of Hispanic students, 39% of students of Two or More Races, and 38% of white students completed their studies within three years, which meets our target expectations.


3) Overall Cohort Total Completion Rate by Financial Aid Status

Target: 30% of PELL recipients and 40% of non-PELL recipients will complete within three years.

Threshold of Acceptability: 25% of PELL Recipients and 35% of non-PELL Recipient will complete within three years.

Conclusion: For the academic year 2019-20, 28% of students who received PELL Grants could complete their degree within three years. This percentage meets the acceptable threshold of 25%. On the other hand, 40% of students who did not receive PELL Grants could complete their degree within three years, which meets our target of having 40% of non-PELL grant recipients complete their degree within the same timeframe.

Employment Success

BRCC measures employment outcomes by tracking Career and Technical (CTE) graduates who secure employment within six months of graduation, using data from the Virginia Employment Commission (VEC).


Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs include Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degrees, Certificates (CERT), and Career Studies Certifications (CSC).

Target: 77% of CTE graduates will be employed within six months of graduation.

Threshold of Acceptability: 65% of CTE graduates will be employed within six months of graduation.

Licensure


BRCC measures licensure success for programs that require external licensure exams during or after program completion.
