## A Commitment to Virginia's Community Colleges

We are committed to admitting qualified students from Virginia's community colleges. Although there is no VCCS Guaranteed Transfer Agreement for the McIntire School of Commerce, we typically have more than half of our incoming transfer students from the Virginia Community College System.

#### **A Holistic Admissions Process**

McIntire is committed to holistically evaluating many facets of an individual's preparation. When reviewing application materials, we look at traditional empirical measures of academic achievement, but we also look for things that indicate a diversity of backgrounds and experiences, emotional intelligence, community engagement, and intellectual curiosity.

## **Application Process**

Apply to McIntire using the University's Common Application as an intended transfer student to the School of Commerce. Visit UVA's Undergraduate Admission site for more dates and deadlines. We only admit students for a fall semester start.

### **Prerequisite Courses**

You are encouraged to complete two years, including these prerequisites courses, at your current college. The School requires you to have a minimum of 54 transferable credits (60-63 credits recommended). You should complete the suggested courses below before *enrolling* at McIntire – not by time you apply.

UVA meets 100% of demonstrated financial need for all in-state and out-of-state students through a combination of grants, work-study, and need-based loans; need-based loans are limited to \$4,500 per year for in-state students. To be considered for a scholarship award, complete the FAFSA and CSS/Financial Aid Profile and all relevant documents by the deadline posted by Student Financial Services.
