At BRCC, student achievement is measured in six areas. The results are analyzed and discussed annually; action plans are developed and implemented when the threshold of acceptability is not met.

1. Course Success Rate

Blue Ridge Community College measures course success rate based on grades of A, B, C, Pass (P), and Satisfactory (S).

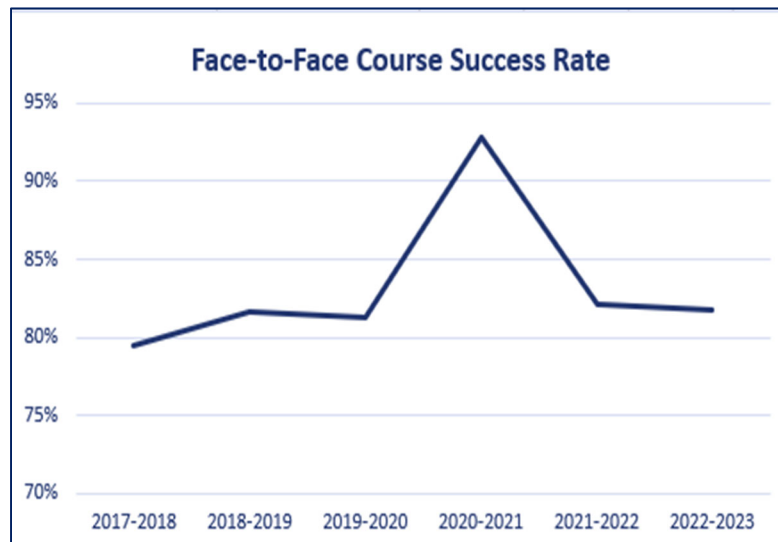
a. Face-to-Face Course Success Rate

Target: 85% of students at BRCC will successfully complete their Face-to-Face courses.

Threshold of Acceptability: 80% of BRCC students will pass Face-to-Face courses.

Conclusion: The success rate for face-to-face courses in 2022-23 was 82%, meeting the 80% threshold.

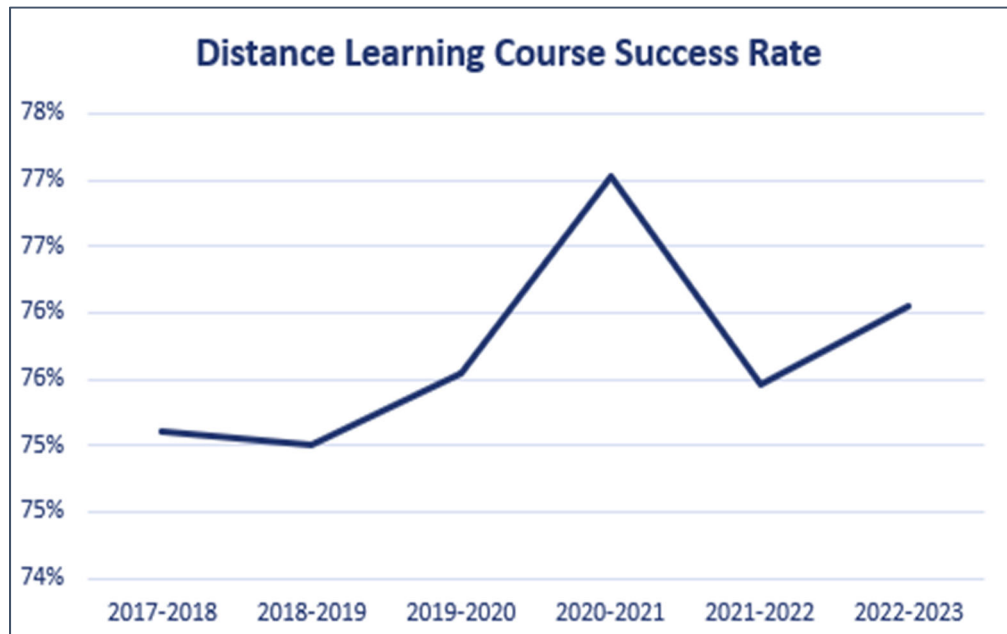
b. Distance Learning Course Success Rate

Target: 77% of students at BRCC will successfully complete their Distance Learning courses.

Threshold of Acceptability: 74% of BRCC students will pass their Distance Learning courses

2. Retention Rate

BRCC's retention rate is the percentage of students from the fall cohort who either returned to BRCC in the following spring/fall semester or graduated from BRCC before the end of fall.

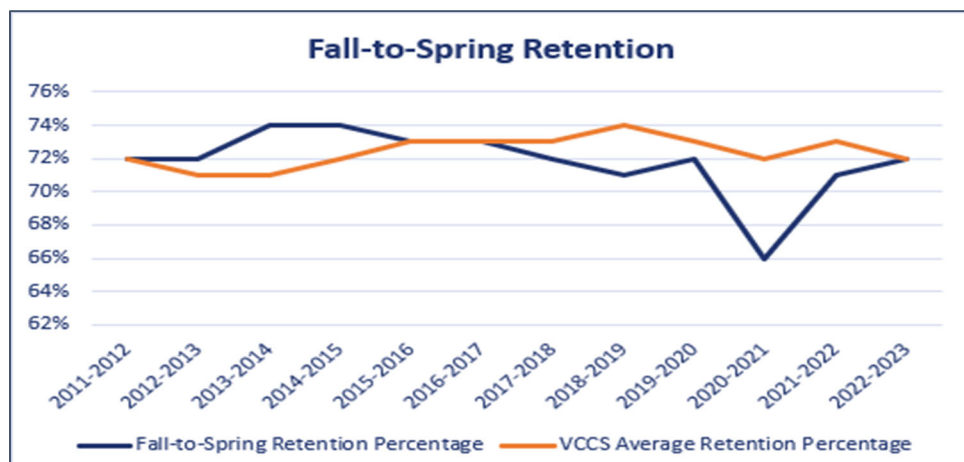
a. Fall-to-Spring Retention Rate

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC's Fall-to-Spring retention rate will be no more than 5% lower than VCCS's average retention rate from Fall to Spring.

Conclusion: The retention rate for Fall 2022-23 was 72%, which met the BRCC target.

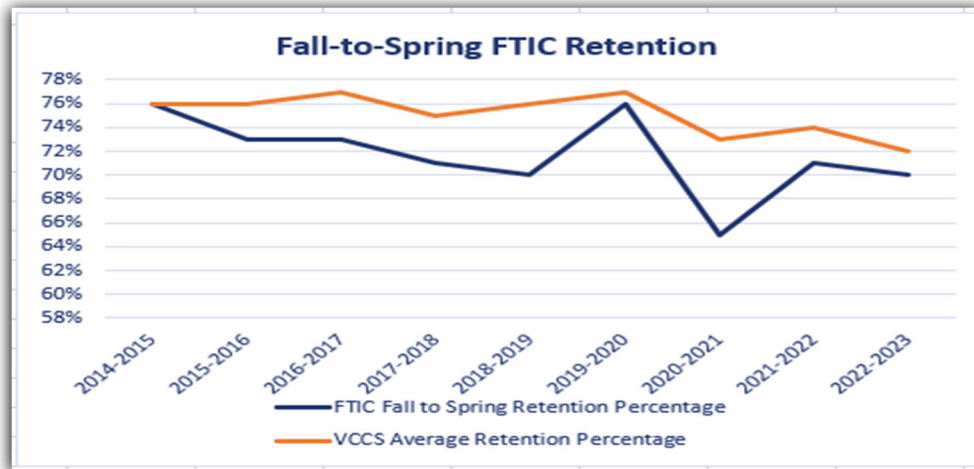
b. Fall-to-Spring FTIC Retention Rate

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC's Fall-to-Spring FTIC retention rate will be no more than 5% lower than VCCS's average FTIC retention rate from Fall to Spring.

Conclusion: In 2022-23, the Fall-to-Spring retention rate for first-time-in-college (FTIC) students was 70%, 2% lower than the average FTIC retention rate for Virginia's Community College System (VCCS). However, this is still within the acceptable threshold of being within 5% of VCCS's average retention rate of 72%.

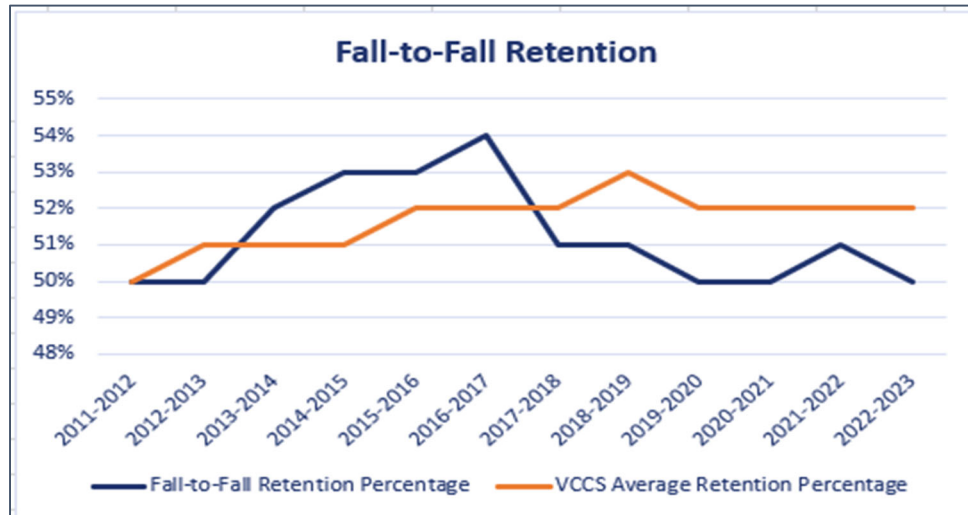
c. Fall-to-Fall Retention Rate

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC's Fall-to-Fall retention rate will be no more than 5% lower than VCCS's average retention rate from Fall to Fall.

Conclusion: In 2022-23, the Fall-to-Fall retention rate was 50%, 2% lower than the average retention rate for Virginia's Community College System (VCCS). However, this is still within the acceptable threshold of being within 5% of VCCS's average retention rate of 52%.

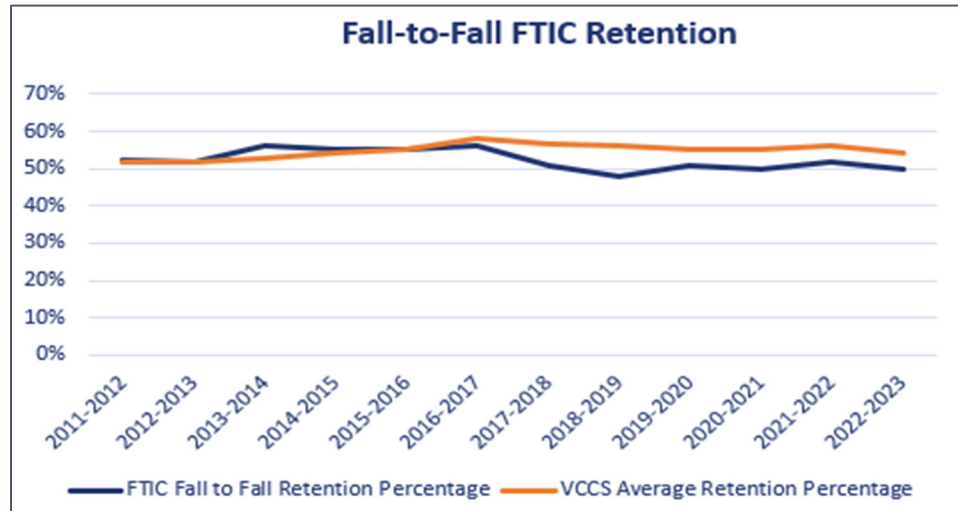
d. Fall-to-Fall FTIC Retention Rate

Conclusion: In 2022-23, the Fall-to-Fall retention rate for first-time-in-college (FTIC) students was 50%, 4% lower than the average FTIC retention rate for Virginia's Community College System (VCCS). However, this is still within the acceptable threshold of being within 5% of VCCS's average retention rate of 54%.

3. Graduation Success

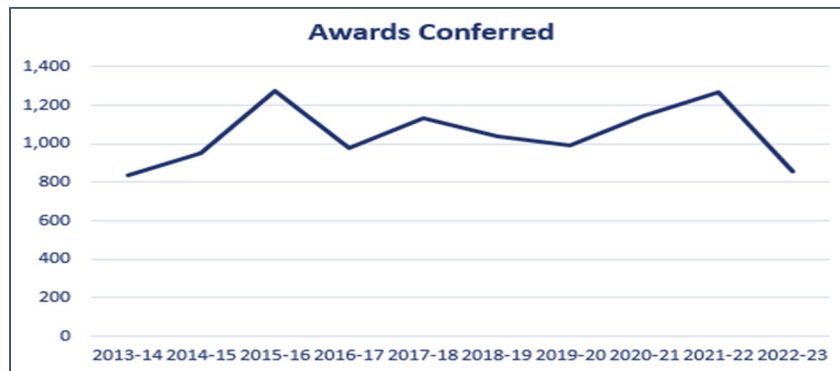
a. Awards Conferred

Target: The total number of awards conferred in the current year is equal to or greater than those conferred in the previous year.

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC will confer awards within a -15% change from the previous year.

Conclusion: In the 2022-23 academic year, BRCC awarded 858 degrees, representing a 32% decrease from the previous year. This is outside our acceptable threshold of a 15% change.

Action Plan: During the pandemic, BRCC students had to deal with more academic challenges and financial constraints, which led to a decline in enrollment. However, to ensure students have the resources they need to succeed, the Student Success Team established comprehensive support systems, including academic counseling, tutoring services, college and career guidance, and mental health support.

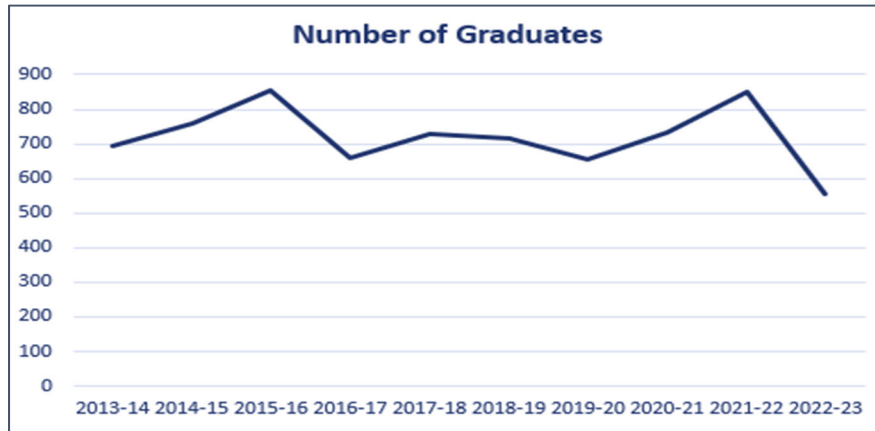
b. Number of Graduates

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC will have within -15% change in total graduates from the previous year.

Conclusion: In 2022-23, BRCC had 556 graduates, a 34% decrease from the previous year, which falls below our acceptable -15% threshold.

c. **NSC Total Completion Rate***

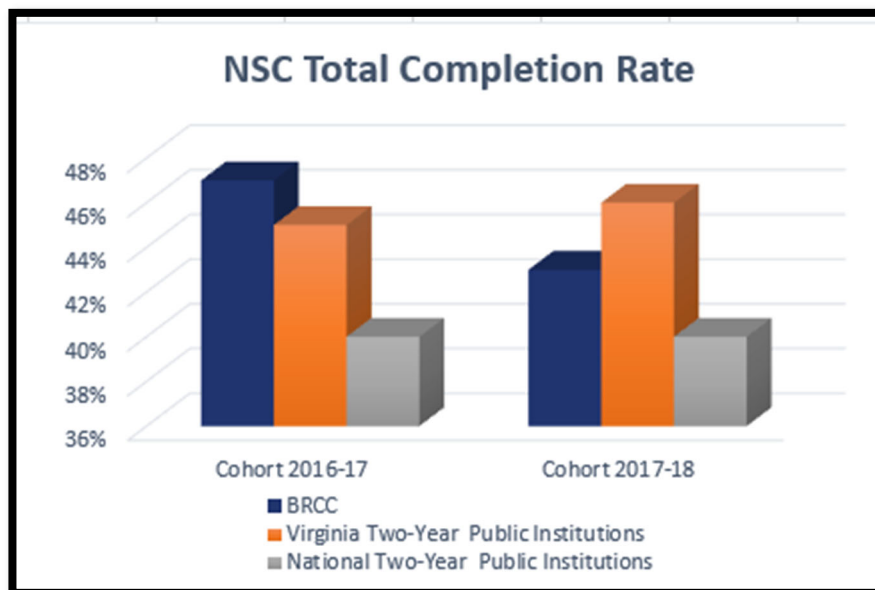
The cohort consists of students entering BRCC for the first time, transferring from another institution, or returning after a period of absence. The completion rates represent the percentage of students who successfully obtain a degree or certificate at BRCC or another institution within six years. We compare the completion rate of our cohort students with those of 11 Virginia's 2-year public institutions and 226 National 2-year public institutions.

Target: The NSC total completion rate of BRCC students is expected to equal that of Virginia's two-year public institutions.

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC's NSC total completion rate will be no more than 5% lower than the average rate for national 2-year public institutions.

Conclusion: In the 2017-18 cohort year, BRCC's NSC total completion rate was 43%. This rate is 3% below the target rate of Virginia's 2-year public institutions. However, it is also 3% higher than the threshold of the NSC total completion rate of national 2-year institutions.

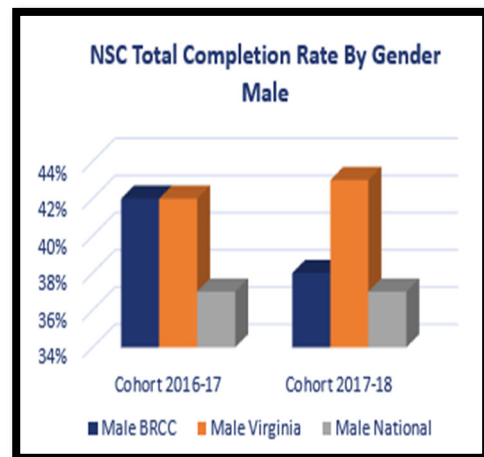
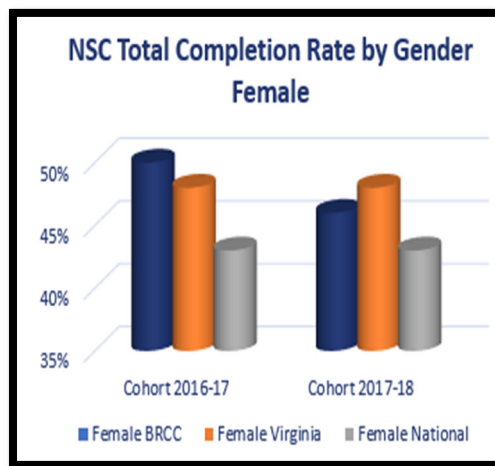
1) NSC Total Completion Rate by Gender

Target: The NSC total completion rates of BRCC female and male students are expected to match those of Virginia's two-year public institutions.

Threshold of Acceptability: The NSC total completion rates of BRCC female and male students will be no more than 5% lower than the average rates for national 2-year public institutions.

Conclusion: In the 2017-18 cohort year, 46% of female students completed their degrees within six years, which is 2% below the target rate of Virginia's 2-year public institutions and 3% above the threshold of national 2-year public institutions' completion rate for female students. Of male students, 38% completed their degrees within six years, which is 5% below the target and 1% above the threshold of acceptability.

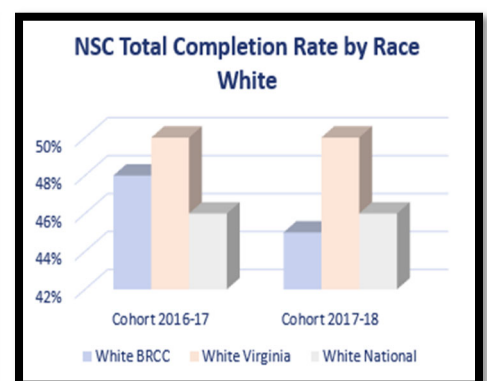
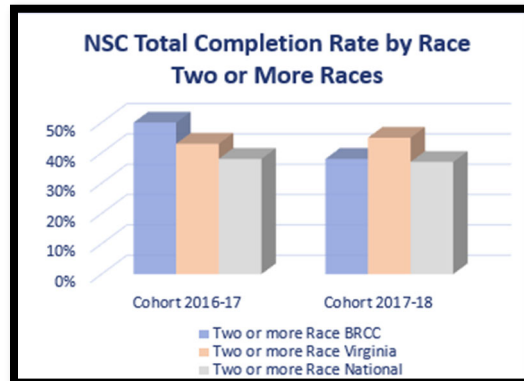
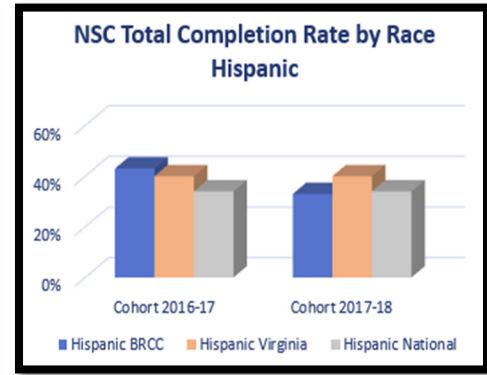
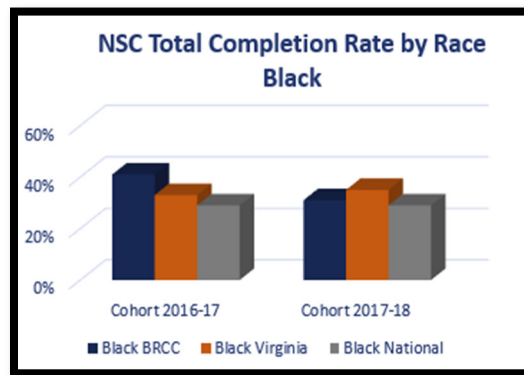
2) NSC Total Completion Rate by Race/Ethnicity

Target: The NSC total completion rates of BRCC Black/African American, Hispanic, Two or More Races, and White students are expected to match those of Virginia's two-year public institutions.

Threshold of Acceptability: The NSC total completion rates of BRCC Black/African American, Hispanic, Two or More Races, and White students will be no more than 5% lower than the average rates for national 2-year public institutions.

Conclusion: In the 2017-18 cohort, 31% of Black students and 38% of Two or More Races students at BRCC completed their studies within six years. These rates are 2% and 1% higher than the national 2-year public institutions' completion rates for Black and Two or More Races students. Additionally, 33% of Hispanic students and 45% of White students completed their studies within six years, surpassing our acceptable completion rates threshold.

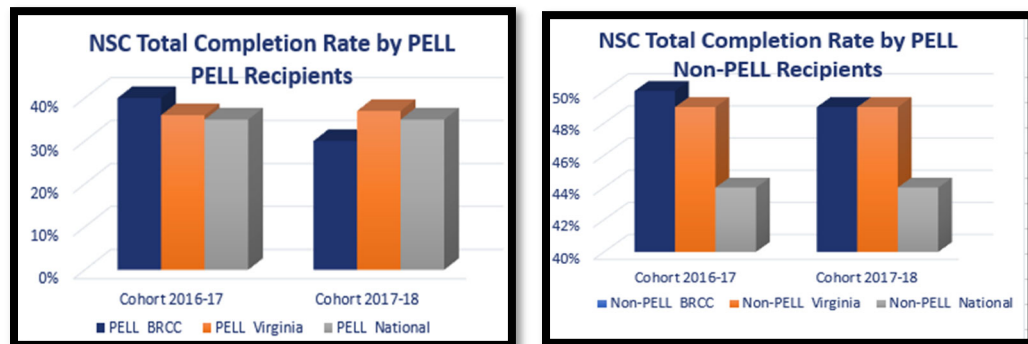
3) NSC Total Completion Rate by Financial Aid Status

Target: The NSC total completion rates of BRCC PELL and non-PELL recipients are expected to match those of Virginia's two-year public institutions.

Threshold of Acceptability: The NSC total completion rates of PELL and Non-PELL recipients will be no more than 5% lower than the average rates for national 2-year public institutions.

Conclusion: In the 2017-18 cohort, 30% of students who received PELL grants completed their degree within six years, which is 5% below the completion rate of national 2-year public institutions' PELL recipients. However, it still meets the acceptable threshold. On the other hand, 49% of non-PELL grant recipients completed their degree within six years, meeting our target rate of Virginia's 2-year public institutions' non-PELL recipients.

4. Transfer Success

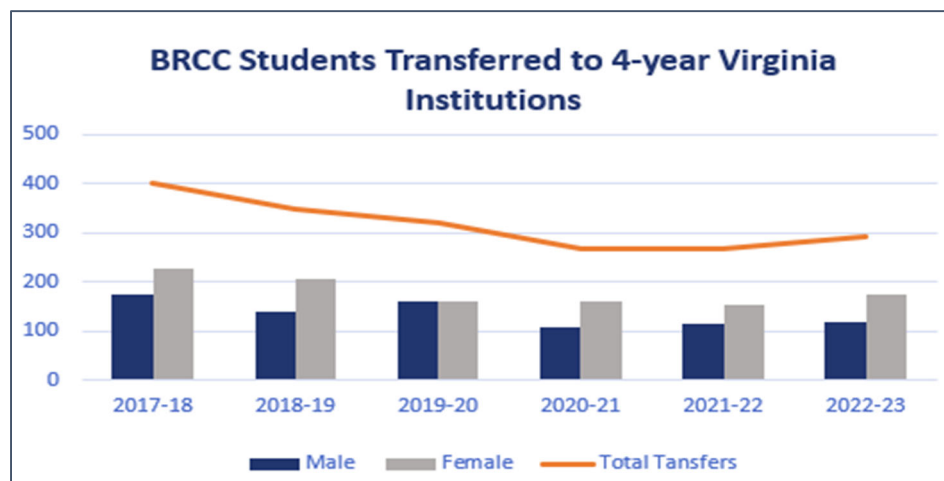
BRCC measures transfer success by examining students in each academic year to determine if the student has subsequently enrolled at a four-year institution.

Target: The total number of students transferred to a four-year university is equal to or greater than those transferred in the previous year.

Threshold of Acceptability: BRCC will transfer within a -15% change from the previous year.

Conclusion: In the academic year 2022-23, 291 BRCC students were successfully transferred to four-year Virginia institutions, a 9% increase from the previous year and meeting the target.

5. Employment Success

BRCC measures employment outcomes by tracking Career and Technical (CTE) graduates who secure employment within six months of graduation, using data from the Virginia Employment Commission (VEC).

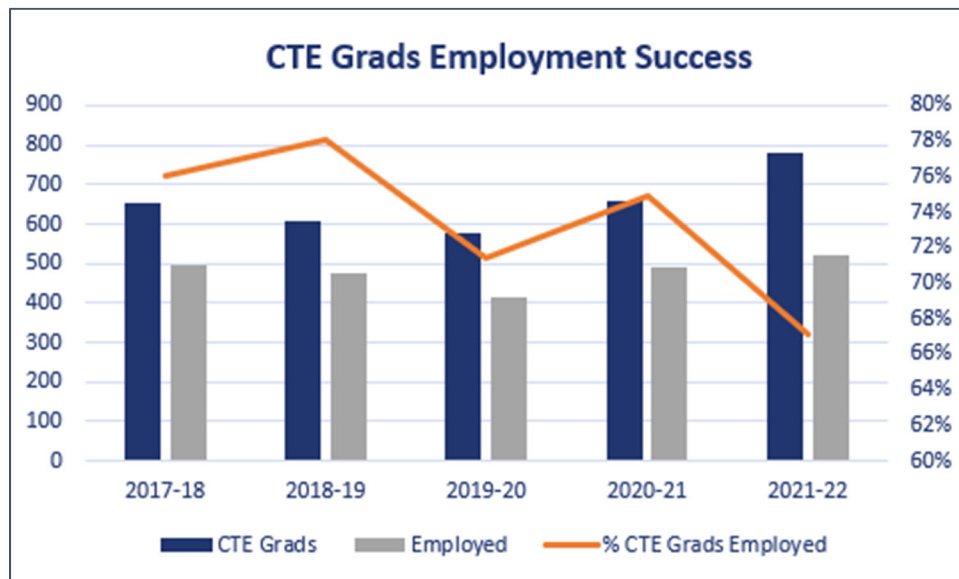
Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs include Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degrees, Certificates (CERT), and Career Studies Certifications (CSC).

Target: 77% of CTE graduates will be employed within six months of graduation.

Threshold of Acceptability: 65% of CTE graduates will be employed within six months of graduation.

Conclusion: 67% of 2021-22 BRCC CTE graduates were employed within six months of graduation, meeting the 65% threshold but falling short of the 77% target.

6. Licensure

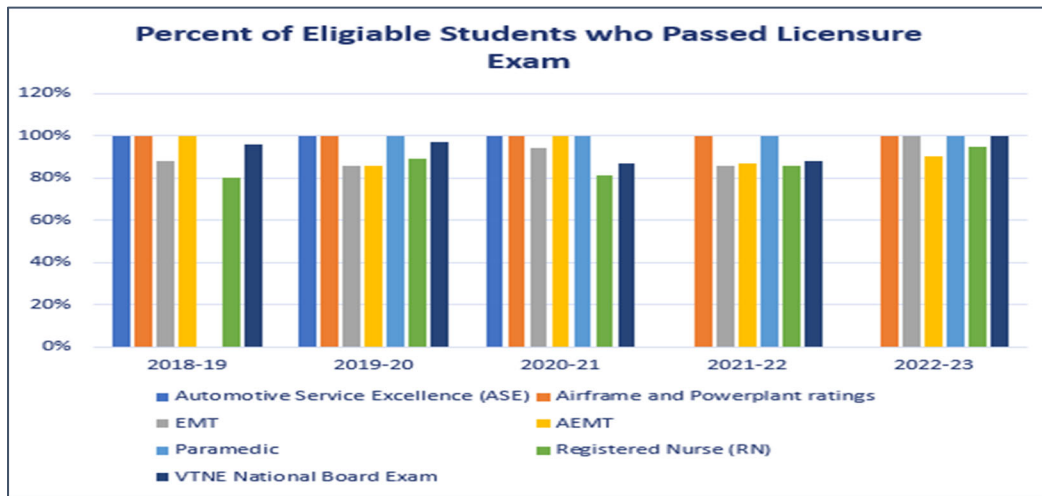
BRCC measures licensure success for programs that require external licensure exams during or after program completion.

Target: 80% of eligible students will pass their licensure exams.

Threshold of Acceptability: 75% of eligible students will pass their licensure exams.
